



# OUTDOOR SCAVENGER HUNT

## DESCRIPTION AND TIPS

**A**n outdoor scavenger hunt can be a fun activity for a picnic, family reunion, or anytime you just want to have a little fun. Gather your hunt participants together, go over the rules, and set them free to run around and compete to see who can come up with the most items on the list. Some items are very straightforward and some require a little creativity.

### Tips:

- Participants can compete as individuals or as teams. Teams should be no more than 2-3 people per team.
- Don't hand out the list until you have gone over the rules.
- Either give participants a bag to use to collect items or have them bring their own prior to the start of the hunt.
- You could also play by telling the group just one item at a time. The first person to bring it to you gets a point. Then, have them return the items (if necessary) to their original location before you tell them the next item on the list. This means no clean up for you when the game is over! You can keep score throughout the game and award prizes for first place or for everyone...it's up to you.
- Have fun!
